Fund your research and foster your career with the Marie Curie fellowships sponsored by the European Commission

This event is organized by Elisa Cazzato, Marie Curie Fellow (NYU/Cà Foscari) in the Department of Art History, with the support of Ida Caiazza (NYU/University of Oslo), Marie Curie Fellow in the Department of Italian Studies. The workshop will provide preliminary information on the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Postdoctoral Fellowships (MSC-PFs), which are funded by the EU program for research and innovation, Horizon Europe. The aim of these postdoctoral fellowships is to foster career development and excellence in research, and both European and U.S. scholars are eligible to apply for them. They are designed for researchers with a PhD in all disciplines who wish to carry out their research activities abroad, acquire new skills, and develop their careers. MSC-PFs help researchers gain experience in other countries, different disciplines, and non-academic sectors. Interested researchers submit an application to the EU together with a host organization, which can be a university or a research institution based in an EU Member State.

The MSC-PFs support the recruited researcher in the form of a living stipend, a travel allowance, and, if applicable, funds to support family members, long-term leave, and special needs. In addition, funding is provided for research, training, and networking activities, as well as management and indirect costs.
